BREAD FOR THE WORLD Letter Writing Sunday, April 26

Question: Do you remember when federal child nutrition programs began?

Answer: If you were in school in 1946, you may remember the National School Lunch Act and the beginning

of hot lunches at school. At that time, it was seen as a measure of national security, to safeguard the

health and well-being of the nation's children.

Question: Do you know the connection between national security and concern for child nutrition

programs?

Answer: Recruits needed for World War II were unable to pass the physical examination due to malnutrition.

Those eighteen year old recruits began life during the Great Depression. After nearly 70 years, one in five children in the United States live in households that struggle to put food on the table, even

though many of the parents have a job and work hard.

give a stone?
