BREAD FOR THE WORLD Letter Writing Sunday, April 26

Question: Is there strong support for child nutrition programs in Congress?

Answer: Traditionally, these programs have had strong bipartisan support. Given the federal budget

climate and divided government, this reauthorization could be impacted by partisan gridlock. It is up to each one of us to make sure our congressional representatives know

the importance to us of their passing a child nutrition bill which closes the hunger gap.

Question: What can I do besides write a letter?

Answer: Letter writing seems to be most effective; but emails, phone calls, and face to face visits to

their home offices are also good ways to communicate your conviction that all children

should be hunger-free.

Remember to ask God to use our collective advocacy in His work to end hunger and grant wisdom and compassion to our national decision makers as they renew child nutrition programs.
