While there, they will participate and serve in a number of areas. A priority will be to visit the surrounding bush villages to assess the clean water needs of the people. Participants from First Presbyterian are Rich and Janet Schaefer, Richard and Joyce Lambert, Andy Cotton, and Matt Drumheller. We will be joined in Mwandi by Kathy and Winston Faust from Pearisburg Presbyterian Church, Pearisburg, VA. Kathy and Winston have been a part of our Mwandi group since our first trip in 2008.

We can all participate in their trip by providing any of the following needed items:

Gloves for doctors and nurses

Gauze

Cotton Balls

Thermometers

Materials are needed for a new *special needs* class. Students range in grades 1 through 6. Books for pupils with intellectual disabilities:
