There will be no Children's Church during August.


Thanks to Adam Jolly and Uwharrie Sound for sharing their musical talent with us in worship this morning.

Volunteer Opportunities at Central School


School has started and the needs are always many. These are some of the ways we can help throughout the year:

MORNING OF MISSION SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 19
