Communion Workshop for Children

A Communion Workshop is planned for children in Kindergarten -2^{nd} grade for the afternoon of **Sunday**, **September 27**. During this time, children and families will learn more about the Lord's Supper and symbols of this sacrament. Plan to stay for lunch. The workshop will conclude by 2:00 p.m.

Covenant Bible Study...Tuesday Mornings...Beginning October 6 at 10:00 a.m.

Covenant guides participants in a comprehensive indepth study of the Bible. The study emphasizes the biblical concept of *covenant* as a unifying theme through all the books of the Old & New Testaments. It underscores the unique relationship that God chooses to have with humanity. This relationship is grounded in the faithfulness of God's love and in our ongoing commitment to love God while we share signs of God's love with other people. Covenant is a 24 week study. We will complete the study in three 8 week sessions; 1 fall, 1 winter, & 1 spring. Folks are encouraged (but not required) to plan to complete all three sessions.

Cost for the study guides is: \$20 for 1 session or \$49 for all 3 sessions
