Covenant Bible Study Tuesday Mornings Beginning October 6 at 10:00 a.m. (Notice Date Change)

Covenant guides participants in a comprehensive indepth study of the Bible. The study emphasizes the biblical concept of covenant as a unifying theme through all the books of the Old & New Testaments. It underscores the unique relationship that God chooses to have with humanity. This relationship is grounded in the faithfulness of God's love and in our ongoing commitment to love God while we share signs of God's love with other people. Covenant is a 24 week study. We will complete the study in three 8 week sessions; 1 fall, 1

winter, & 1 spring. Folks are encouraged (but not required) to plan to complete all three sessions.
