# SOUPER BOWL OF CARING ON SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 7 Bring your cans of food to the pit stop on Sunday, February 7!

Sunday, February 7 is not only the day of the big football game, it is also the Souper Bowl of Caring. Youth will be collecting money and cans of food at the doors of the sanctuary following worship. Depending on where you typically sit in the sanctuary, you are encouraged to bring in a certain kind of canned soup. As you face the front of the sanctuary, if you typically sit on the right side (choir loft side) of the middle section, the right section, or the balcony, you are asked to bring in chicken noodle soup. If you sit on the left side of the middle section, the left section, or the section near the sound board, you are asked to bring in tomato soup. Youth will also be collecting canned food and money following worship.
