






THE WEST AFRICA INITIATIVE

Since 2007, the West Africa Initiative (WAI) has assisted in the rebuilding and rehabilitation of Liberia and Sierra Leone following years of civil wars. The three programs supported by One Great Hour of Sharing (Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, the Presbyterian Hunger Program, and Self-Development of People) have worked together with the people in West Africa to improve their lives and communities.

Increased Food Security & Livelihoods

More than 65 communities have received training and assistance to establish farming and microbusinesses, leading to self-reliant food production and decreased effects of food shortages.¹



Tools for Women to Lead

Hundreds of women have participated in livelihood training programs through the WAI, including beekeeping, raising livestock, and moringa tree production. These programs equip women with the knowledge and tools to provide for themselves and their families.²

Recovering from the Ebola Epidemic

The recent Ebola epidemic was a major setback for the progress in West Africa. The disease cost thousands of lives, forced businesses and schools to close, and led to food shortages. Communities involved in the WAI's efforts have seen increased resiliency, but the region as a whole is still recovering from the crisis.



Caring for Orphaned Children

It's estimated that more than 25,000 orphans live in Liberia and Sierra Leone, a number that dramatically increased due to the Ebola epidemic.³
