BREAD FOR THE WORLD

Focus: Helping Mothers & Children Survive & Thrive Letter Writing Sunday, April 24 9:00 a.m.-11:00 a.m. & following worship in the pit stop



Ending hunger is more than just providing enough food to survive. It is also having the right foods for good nutrition – providing a diet rich in protein and carbohydrates, vitamins and minerals for health, growth, and strength of both bodies and minds. This year, we focus on mothers and children because they are the most vulnerable groups to hunger and malnutrition. Women are primary caregivers of children and comprise nearly half the world's smallholder farmers. Being a smallholder farmer means living on the edge – climate change, natural disasters, and variety and quantity of food that can be grown on a small plot of land – seriously limits what the family eats. Help make a difference for women and children by joining letter writers in the pit stop on Sunday, April 24. We will have writing material and information to help compose a letter to our congressional leaders.
