All creation, join in praising God the Father, Spirit, Son, Evermore your voices raising to the eternal Three in One: Come and worship, come and worship, worship Christ, the coming King. Each week during Advent, we will sing hymns about the character whose candle we are lighting. We begin with the angel.

Isaiah 64:1

Filled with Old Testament imagery, this hymn speaks of Christ as the fulfillment of God's promises.

The Gloria Patri, also called the Lesser Doxology, has been used in worship for centuries as a response of praise. This practice later found its way into our hymns when authors chose to incorporate a paraphrase of this Trinitarian text as the final stanza. This setting of Charles Wesley's Advent hymn (#82) uses an 18th century form in which the organ provides a two-part accompaniment to the hymn sung by the choir. The organ's dance-like figuration and rhythmic syncopation in the choral parts contributes to the joyous, festive feeling of John Carter's 1992 anthem.

The Scots Confession was written by six ministers, including John Knox, after Scotland was declared a Protestant nation in 1560.

Using an Irish folk tune, the hymn joyfully anticipates the great changes accompanying God's incarnation.
