#### **BREAD FOR THE WORLD**

Question: How will my writing a letter to our three congressmen make a difference

in the federal budget?

Answer: Prayer and faithful advocacy helped stop devastating cuts to Medicaid and Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Women,

Infant, Children (WIC) nutrition programs and school meals last year.

Handwritten letters remain the most effective way to communicate with Congress, but e-mails and phone calls also help to raise a

collective voice urging Congress to invest in programs to end hunger.

Session has called a congregational meeting following worship on April 22. The purpose of the meeting is to act on the report of the Congregational Nominating Committee. At that time, they will nominate Jeff Robertson to fill a term on the Diaconate in the class of 2020. Additional nominations may be made from the floor. Jeff Robertson is nominated to serve as a deacon. Following a 33 year career with Wyeth Pharmaceuticals and Pfizer Vaccines, Jeff has retired and is residing in Norwood with his wife, Kim. They have one daughter, Kate, who lives in Chattanooga, TN. During his career, Jeff, Kim, and Kate had many great experiences living in North Carolina, Georgia, and Pennsylvania. At First Presbyterian Church, Jeff is active in the Toby Webb Men's Prayer Breakfast group, serves as an usher, serves on the Property Committee, and assists with the children's Cooking Camp for a week in the summer. In the community, Jeff participates in the Albemarle Rotary Club (2018-19 Club Director and serves on the Scholarship Committee), in the Patient and Family Advisory Council at Atrium-Stanly, and is a Blood Drive Ambassador for the American Red Cross.
