Thanks to the Youth Club Faith Explorers and Trusty Travelers for sharing their musical leadership in worship.





Answer: About 2/3 of SNAP recipients are children, the elderly of


Answer: About 2/3 of SNAP recipients are children, the elderly, or disabled.
