September 30-October 21 The SCCM Caring & Sharing Campaign will begin on Sunday, September 30 and run through Sunday, October 21. Your loose change and bills dropped into a little yellow cup have a tremendous impact on the SCCM programs. In 2017, the Albemarle and Norwood Community Tables served 60,387 meals, the Food Pantry distributed 666,695 pounds of food, and the Assistance Center provided \$111,625 in utility, rent, and medicine assistance.
