The acolyte today is Elizabeth Bryson. After extinguishing the Christ candle, the acolyte takes the light of Jesus Christ out into the world.



Habitat for Humanity Project Update Groundbreaking for the Badin House Sunday, November 11 at 12:45 p.m.
