**Opioid Taskforce...**A group of FPC members has begun having conversations about what our congregation might do to help address the crisis of opioid abuse in Stanly County. As part of our conversations, we have been seeking to education ourselves and the congregation about drug abuse. Did you know...

- 46 people across the country died every day from overdoses involving prescription pain medications (opioids) in the year 2016.
- Data from 2016 shows that 1 out of every 10 people over the age of 12 struggles with some level of substance abuse, including addiction to prescription medications.
- 50% of people who misuse prescription pain medications obtained them from a friend or family member for free.

Please keep those who struggle with drug abuse and addiction and their families in your prayers, and keep your eyes out for more information and further updates from the opioid taskforce.
