



Making the Road: Walking through Lent
Daily Emailed Devotions begin Sunday, March 6

These devotions are based on the Spanish poet Antonio Machado's poem, Walker. Machado writes: Walker, there is no road, the road is made by walking.

Machado's poem resonates because it feels as if there is no road in front of us. The soil of our well-worn Lenten path has been overturned by the pandemic. If we want to follow Christ this Lent, we'll need to prepare the way and make the road. We'll need to rethink and recreate our Lenten practices.

This 6-week set of Lenten devotions includes daily reflections and prayers written by *Outlook* Editor, Teri McDowell Ott. Each week, we will make the road to Jerusalem through the following themes:

Walking through Lent, Walking in the Wilderness, Walking in Prayer, Walking with Others, Walking in Hope, Walking through Holy Week

You will receive a daily email devotion of *Making the Road: Walking through Lent*. Printed copies will be mailed to those who do not have access to the internet, and some will be available at both entrances to the church for visitors.
