

Peter Henkenjohann moved a hive of bees into the new boxes and all of the honey produced by these bees will be bottled and sold with proceeds going to benefit a Ukrainian charitable organization.


## FAITH ON THE FIFTH OFFERING FOR BOOK BUDDIES LITERACY CAMP SUNDAY, MAY 29
