Central United Methodist Church has scheduled a Book Buddies Literacy Camp this summer for June 20-July 29. The camp will be open from 8:00 a.m.-3:00 p.m. and will include 24 rising first graders who would benefit from low student-to-teacher

ratio educational opportunity. They ask for donations (it costs an average of \$1600 per camper) and/or volunteers. 


